



Get your child's voice heard and make a difference

The Children's Commissioner for England, Dame Rachel de Souza, is launching a once-in-a-generation review of children's lives.

It's called 'The Childhood Commission' and it will identify the barriers preventing children reaching their full potential and propose policy solutions to address them.

Why your child should take part

At its heart is 'The Big Ask' – the largest ever consultation held with children between the ages of 4 to 17. In this survey the Children's Commissioner is asking children and young people what they think is important for their future and what is holding young people back. The Children's Commissioner will use what children and young people tell her to show the Government what they think and what they need to live happier lives.

This survey will only take you **5-10 minutes**.

The survey is split into different age groups, so children can fill in the version appropriate for their age. Easy-read 'accessible' versions as well as a version for care leavers are also available.

Your child's privacy

We won't ask for their name, phone number or email, and we'll keep what they tell us safe and private – it won't be shared with anyone else. They don't have to answer any question if you don't want to.

It's an exciting opportunity to help us think big and it's a chance for every child in England to have their voice heard.
